



## **Digital Photojournalism Instructor**

The Department of Communication at Mississippi State University seeks applications for an instructor position in Digital Photojournalism. The department consists of almost 500 undergraduate majors in five concentrations (Broadcasting, Communication Studies, Journalism, Public Relations, and Theatre).

The successful candidate will teach courses in Introduction to Photography as Communication, Introduction to Web Communication, and/or related production courses. The successful candidate should be familiar with Adobe/Macromedia products and needs to be comfortable working in a Macintosh environment. Instructors typically teach four classes per semester. Summer and intensive classes may also be available for an extra stipend.

Service includes advising majors and student organizations, developing curriculum, and serving on committees. Service activities within the community and professional disciplines also are recognized as aspects of faculty achievement.

For instructor positions, a master's degree in the field and demonstrated teaching proficiency are required. Teaching experience and work experience in the appropriate field are preferred for all positions. Expertise in public relations and journalism production is a plus. The successful candidate must have a thorough knowledge of the field and a willingness to participate collegially in a broad department. Colleagues must be able to communicate that knowledge in the classroom environment to students as well as to other important groups through service. Salary and benefits are competitive.
