### **Upper Division Hours:**

\_ General Elective

Upper Division classes are labeled at the 3000-4000 level. Students are required to take 31 upper division hours in the College of Arts & Sciences. The Print & Digital Journalism curriculum provides 31 hours of upper division credit, thus meeting the Arts & Sciences requirement.
